OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

The LAWN GENIE is a flail type mower with a combination mowing and pick-up feature. It is used for mowing, thatching, and clean-up work. Picking up grass trimmings and leaves in the spring and fall is an easy chore because of its hopper and basket arrangement.

For best results, the operation of the LAWN GENIE should be clearly understood. The rotor is a large diameter tube with 38 patented hangers with two patented replaceable swinging knives to each hanger. These high carbon steel hangers and knives are arranged in four evenly spaced rows across the length of the rotor to give uniform cut the full width of the mower. SEE ILLUSTRATION A Page 2.

The hangers are fastened to the rotor with special lock nuts. These lock nuts draw up tight enough to securely hold the hanger and knives, yet loose enough to allow the hanger and knives to swing easily.

The LAWN GENIE, with its own 8 H.P. gasoline engine is rugged enough to use in a variety of ways as anyone will find out after using it for a short time.

The engine is equipped with a centrifugal type clutch pulley. When the engine is idling, the clutch pulley is disengaged. When you apply full throttle, the centrifugal force engages the clutch pulley to drive the rotor.

A safety guard has been installed on each side of the machine to guard against the operator's foot getting caught in the cutting mechanism and also to prevent a tire from being hooked around a tree or fence post. Do not remove these guards.

<u>Pole Adjustment:</u> The LAWN GENIE should run level with the tractor for the best cutting job. The hitch tongue adjusts in three positions. Bolt the tongue in any of three pivot holes under the front of the machine to level it with the tractor and ground.

<u>Damper Adjustment</u>: To <u>mow and load</u> the clippings, pull the damper rod on the side of the throttle mount <u>forward</u>. To <u>mow only</u>, push the damper rod <u>back</u>. This opens or closes the damper gate which allows clippings to travel up the hopper and into the basket or directly back to the ground.

MOWING

For normal lawn mowing you can easily set the <u>cutting height</u> by turning the crank on the left front side of the machine. It is best to set the height so that the rear roller clears the ground and only engages when you encounter a rise or dip in the surface. This roller is to help eliminate scalping.

When cutting heavy grass from 4-6" in height your ground speed should be slower than if the grass were only 2" high. Determine the type of job you have and govern your cutting speed accordingly.

When cutting fresh and tender or wet grass, it may be difficult to dump the basket because of the extra weight. Under these conditions it is advisable to only partially fill the basket before dumping it.

If you wish to pick up wet grass, do it in a two-part operation. Close the damper by pushing the control rod mounted on the throttle console. This will direct the grass clippings back onto the ground. Later, go back and pick up the grass when it has dried.

THATCHING

To thatch and pick up old dead grass, you may cut directly and load into the basket or deflect the material to the ground and then come back and pick it up later. Normally for a thatching operation set the cutting height so that the roller is in direct contact with the ground.

LEAF CLEANUP

An important feature of the LAWN GENIE is its ability to do the back-breaking job of leaf removal. Mowing with the standard machine will cut up the leaves and decrease their volume for pickup. They can be dumped and composted or bagged for removal.

A leaf grinder attachment is available which can easily be inserted in the rear portion of the LAWN GENIE. (See illustration — Page 6). With this low cost attachment, leaves are cut up or mulched enough to be left on the ground to disintegrate and disappear into the soil.

If you choose to pick up the mulched leaves, pull out the damper push rod, go back over the lawn and load the leaves into the basket. It is not necessary to remove the grinder attachment for this part of the operation.

MAINTENANCE — <u>ALL MAINTENANCE MUST BE DONE WITH MOTOR OFF</u>

CLUTCH and BEARINGS

The drive clutch, rotor bearings, and ground roller bearings can be serviced by replacement only.

BASKET

If the basket's fabric becomes mutilated or badly worn, a new plastic fabric is easily snapped into place. Purchase from your LAWN GENIE dealer.

BELT ADJUSTMENT

It is important to have the engine up to speed and the belt tight on the pulley in order to provide the traction necessary to drive the rotor. If belt slippage occurs, immediately stop the engine and check the belt tension. Tighten the belt by increasing the tension on the spring tightner.

If the rotor does not turn, check the drive belt. If the drive belt is tight and the rotor does not turn, the rotor is likely jammed by some field debris and requires clearing. Be sure engine is shut off.

CLEANING

When cutting wet grass, the grass may build up on the underside of the machine. It is recommended that you hose down the housing, hopper and rotor after use. A clean hopper provides a smooth flow for the material to the basket.

KNIVES and ROTOR

The knives can be reversed to expose a new cutting edge. If necessary, the knives can be removed and sharpened on any electrical bench grinder.

The rotor must not be run with knives missing. If knives are lost or missing, the rotor will be out of balance and the machine will vibrate. If this happens, stop the engine and inspect the knives by lifting off the basket and opening or removing the rear inspection cover. Refer to Mathews Company Parts List if replacements are necessary.

TIRES & WHEELS


Tire pressure must be equal in order to obtain an even cut. Grease the wheel bearings once a year with grease fitting on the wheel.

ENGINE

The engine manufacturers manual clearly illustrates all Operating and Maintenance Instructions for the engine. (Enclosed in Warranty Envelope).

HEIGHT ADJUSTMENT CRANK

A few drops of oil on the bearing and screw will ensure easy, quick adjustment.

Row 3 - All hanger threads (11) pointed to the left






